

- 4. STUDENTS Free Club membership but must be a current AMA member.

SAFETY FIRST

If you are programming, tuning, or binding your transmitter to your electric powered airplane, please be advised to REMOVE your propeller before you do any of the above. Sometimes just things like reversing simple throttle settings can start the prop turning at maximum RPM's. You really don't want that to happen on your workbench, or for that matter, anywhere. Receivers that have lost the bind to the transmitters can start the motor when you connect the battery power. I know this from experience.
