

Fly so try not to miss it.

Flying has been tough the last couple of months so your editor has been busy in the shop. Have a 1/20 scale Bellanca Aircruiser that is ready for its first flight. At 39 inches and 19 ounces it should fly well. Also drawing up a 1/12 scale Aircruiser. Is it really a biplane? With a 65 inch wing span is it IMAA legal? Also took a couple of planes that had brushed motors and Nicads and replaced then with brushless motors and 3 cell Li-Pos. The Mercury racer, below, now weighs 7 ounces less and has twice the power and 2 1/2 times the battery capacity. Neither John Woods nor I could get it off the ground before primarily because of wheel wobble. It now has new wheels also. It should now fly. The Four Star-40 (aka PT-19) seen lower right still has about the same power but weighs 1.6 pounds less (31%) with 3 times the battery capacity. I did get the chance to fly it last Saturday and it does fly very well and fast. The biggest problem was getting it to come down since it was so light.

Time to land for this month.....ed.
