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

You can go on FAA's website and fill in the info to receive a new card with the new expiration date. For your information the FAA is trying to implement "Remote Identification" that would be required on all model Aircraft/Drones. Your plane would broadcast your Identification, your location and track your flight pattern back to the FAA..... sounds expensive. All the new rules have to go through the bureaucratic process and will take several years but the freedom we had is in jeopardy.

We are going to cancel this month's meeting and meet May 12th at the field. Don said the South Port Club house is closed till further notice

There are no scheduled Club meetings for January, February, March or April.

A little info on the Carbon Cub 15cc.

It has a 90" wingspan, and is 60" in length, It should weigh in at 11 -12 lbs. when finished.

The motor is a Suppo .60 size, and the ESC is a Castle Creations Talon 90 amp. Prop will be a 16X10" 2 blade.

Battery is a 6 cell 5000mah. Receiver is a 10 channel Admiral with satellite antenna.

It uses 6 standard size servos, 2 flaps, 2 ailerons, elevator and rudder.

It has LED landing lights actuated by a control module plugged into the receiver.

I printed out a new instrument panel from pictures of the real one used by Cub Crafters Inc. The pilot is a Met Life promo doll.
