



Hi everyone,

Hopefully we are going to get some warmer weather soon, and we can get back to flying out at the field.

I just want to caution every body to please check your airplanes out BE-FORE you make the trip out to the field.

Check things like...the prop nut being tight...are all the nuts and bolts tight...check the control horns and arms....check the control directions and deflections... test those batteries that have been idle and finally, do a radio range check on that radio that has been sitting around all winter.

If you are not sure of something, get an opinion or ask another member to help you out.
