

### **MEETING MINUTES**

#### TRI-LAKES R/C FLYING CLUB June 10, 2008

President Dave Medley opened the meeting at 6:30 p.m. at Rocky Top Field. All officers were present. There were 13 members present. The minutes from the May meeting were approved as published in the June Newsletter. Treasurer Erv Rohde reported that the current treasury balance was \$2660.18 as of June 1<sup>st</sup>. The 50/50 raffle was won by John Woods who received one half of \$11.

**Committee Reports:** There were no committee reports.

Announcements and Old Business: Bob Pilecki handed out the certificates from the May fun fly that was rescheduled from April. 1<sup>st</sup> Place Timed Flight with Loops & John Woods' Las Vegas went to Bud Austin. 1<sup>st</sup> Place Precision Dead Stick Landing was a tie between John Woods & Dick Ross. Overall places were as follows: 3<sup>rd</sup>-Dick Ross, 2<sup>nd</sup>-John Woods, 1<sup>st</sup>-Bud Austin

Discussion regarding the field condition ensued – Howard Shire said that the granules for grub control have been put out and Fritz Corbin has been working on getting prices for top soil to have on had to fill any future holes.

The first aid kit is not available – Gene Fuson will be contacted to see if he has it.

John Woods gave a detailed report of the problems with Sandy's complaint and his subsequent phone conversations with the actual owners of the property. At the present time, we do not have a problem with the owners, only a potential one with our neighbors. It is imperative that we do not create any problems that can aggravate the situation. Be sure to always close and lock the gates at either end of the field. If Sandy should approach you with any complaints be courteous

and report the incident to a Club Officer immediately so that we can contact the owners.

In conjunction with the neighbor problems, Annette McEvov reported her conversation with Greg Haan of AMA regarding noise control. He is presently drafting a report for AMA to try to come up with recommendations for clubs to use as a guideline and was very impressed that we were taking a pro-active preventative approach as many clubs are loosing their flying fields due to this very situation. He gave her guite a bit of information. After considerable discussion among members, it was decided that we ask Jim Halbert if he will let us use his decibel meter and we will check all of the planes to find out how much noise we are putting out and take corrective action if needed.

**New Business:** The June 14<sup>th</sup> Fun Fly is a go with the events as published in the Newsletter.

Discussion regarding the Cub Scout event the following Saturday, June 21<sup>st</sup> resulted in John Woods volunteering to have the Club's trainer ready for use and Dave Medley, Fritz Crobin and Howard Shire donating additional planes for use. We'll use a name draw to determine the order that the kids are selected. John, Erv Rohde and Joe Major as the intro instructors will take the kids up for flights as time allows. We'll use the following weekend as a rain date if necessary.

Dave will contact the boys ranch-Lives Under Construction to see about putting on an event for them.

**Program:** There was no program.

Meeting adjourned at 7:30. The next meeting will be July 8<sup>th</sup> - 6:30 p.m. at Rocky Top Field.

# JUNE FUN FLY

At last! A good day for a Fun Fly. There was a little breeze but it would have been fairly hot without it.

After the traditional lunch of hotdogs, sodas, chips and goodies, it was time for the Pilots meeting and on with the Fun Fly

The first event was a Spot Landing. Take off, do a touch and go and then touch down on the runway target. Closest touch down to the target wins. You get two chances at this and take the best of the two scores. Coming in First was Fritz Corbin with 3'-3" and in Second Place was John Woods with 4'-9". Third Place went to Erv Rohde with 8'-9", Fourth was Howard Shire at 15'-9" and Fifth was Bud Austin at 21'.

The second event was Erv's Ground Targets. Taxi through the start gate (time starts), knock over 5 targets plane's wing and taxi back through the start gate (time stops). Penalties are break a target-5 seconds, wheels leave ground-10 seconds and destroy the target- 20 seconds. Shortest net time wins. In First Place, and a new comer to Fun Flys, was Dick Peterson with 45 seconds and no penalties. Atta way to go Dick! Second Place was Bud Austin with 46 seconds and no penalties and Third Place went to Jack McEvoy with 59 seconds and also no penalties. Fourth Place went to John Woods with 64 seconds and Fifth was Erv Rohde at 68 seconds. None of the top five finishers had penalties but the rest of the field did earn penalty points. Actually it seemed that many fewer targets were destroyed this time than when

this event was run last year.

The last event of the day was the Box Event (2). Place or taxi your plane into the box which is about 10 feet square and formed with surveyors tape. Take off, do a 360 around the field, land and taxi into the box and stop with at least two wheels in the Box. Repeat the Time starts when the plane first starts to move in the box and stops the second time the wheels stop in the box. There is a 10 second penalty for each time the plane breaks the surveyors tape. **Howard Shire took** First Place with 70 seconds and the only nonpenalized run of the event. Atta way to go Howard! Second Place went to Erv Rohde with 99 seconds including one penalty. Third Place was a tie between Bud Austin and Fritz Corbin at 107 second. This included one penalty for Bud and two For Fritz. In Fifth Place was John Woods with 132 seconds which included one penalty.

Overall First Place winner was Fritz Corbin with 150 Top Gun 2008 points. Second Place was a tie between Howard Shire and Erv Rohde with 140 points each. Fourth Place went to Bud Austin at 130 points and Fifth Place went to John Woods with 120 points.

Once again many thanks to all those that helped on the Fun Fly lunch and in running the events. The next Fun Fly is scheduled for August 16th but could be rescheduled if it interferes with the Springfield R/C Club's Float Fly.
