

TRI-LAKES R/C FLYING CLUB

July 8, 2003

President Howard Shire opened the meeting at 7:04 P.M. at the Rocky Top Field. All officers were present except Ray Dixson. There were 13 members attending. There were two guests, Dick Peterson & Kathy Metzger, in attendance. The minutes from the June meeting were approved as published in the July newsletter. Treasurer Erv Rohde reported that the balance as of July 1st was \$1,284.00. The 50/50 raffle was won by Erv Rohde who received ½ of \$8.00.

Committee Reports:

There were no committee reports.

Announcements and Old Business:

New member, Jason Blevins of Hollister was welcomed, bringing the total Club membership to 53.

Discussion regarding the disposal of the old refrigerator was held. Gary Acton volunteered to remove it after the meeting and take it to a disposal site.

Erv Rohde read a letter of thanks from the 2003 F3ARC Acrobatic team for the \$25.00 contribution that we sent to help with their costs at events representing the USA.

After a report from Mike Anderson & John Woods regarding club t-shirt prices a motion was made, seconded and passed, to put together an order for shirts for \$10.75 plus tax. Then the Club will sell them for \$15.00, the difference going into the club's treasury. Anyone interested in purchasing a shirt, but will not be at the August meeting must contact Mike to place their order. We must have a minimum order of 24. You have a choice of 20 colors and must pay when ordering.

Mike Anderson said that it will be pilots choice for the events again and asked that you contact him with any ideas for new events that you would like to see included.

Program:

Joe Major brought out his newest project currently under construction. His 100 ½" wing Stinson Reliant will be featuring a 26 Zenoah with lots of modifications. He hasn't made up his mind as to colors yet but Joe is NOT impressed with this Top Flite kit. You may want to ask him about it before buying one to build.

John Woods showed his latest "Star Wars" project currently being developed for the Jim Stafford show. John created the original flying saucer that has been in use at the show for quite some time. When Stafford decided that it was time for an update, John was pleased to be able to really show off some of the latest hardware that's available today. He'll be using electric motors mounted on digital servos allowing the craft to move straight up & down, forward and backwards. The lighting that he will be utilizing is super bright and will have a flashing strobe effect. Should really be something to see when he's finished!

At the July meeting Jason Blevins, of Hollister, joined the Club as a new member.








Above is Wade Stine's Great Planes U-CAN-DO 3D ARF going through some maneuvers. The plane can do some fancy tricks and Wade makes it look easy.



Left is John Woods' motor setup for the new flying saucer he is making for the Jim Stafford show. The motors are Speed 300's, the servos rotate 180 degrees and the speed control is reversible, originally intended for model cars. On the space ship the motors will be eight feet apart (I think). The equipment used on this saucer is much smaller than that used on the first flying saucer he made for Stafford.

Below is Ray Wommack's new Four Star 120. Ray built this from a kit and put a nice looking covering job on it. Looks like he has also gone to the gasoline engine. Good looking plane, Ray, but the pilots missing.
