

President Dave Medley opened the meeting at 6:00 p.m. at the Branson RecPlex. All officers were present. There were 12 members present. A correction to the September minutes was that there is 35 not 34 current Club members. Treasurer Erv Rohde reported that the treasury balance as of October 1st was \$1,810.86. The 50/50 raffle was won by Bud Austin who received one half of \$11.

Program:

Joe Major brought his E-flite mini-version of the MX2 helicopter. It's on 2.4 spread technology and can be purchased for \$130 with transmitter or \$100 without (you can use your own 2.4 transmitter but not the DX6). Uses 4 AA batteries for the charger and has a 3.7 volt battery with 110 mAH Li-Po battery. Joe also cautioned everyone using the new JR 9303 to check for the wire rubbing on the aileron wire in their transmitters. This isn't a common problem but has shown up on occasion and can be easily corrected.

Next meeting will be November 11th.

Best Electrics in South Texas New Waverly, TX

Below are some pictures from BEST that your editor attended the first weekend in June.





Recipient of the President's award went to Keith Spark's B-58 Hustler powered by two pusher props on the inboard engine pods. He's thinking of re-powering it with 4 EDF's.



The above plane (probably some sort of "STICK") was small with about an 18 to 20 inch wing span. It looked great and was fast, very maneuverable and flown by a kid about 18. He was doing very well until he was mid-aired, then the little plane came out second best. To the right is a picture of a couple (actually three) of my planes that were posted on the Internet.





The Pilot's Choice award went to this B-29. It has about a six foot span and was covered in aluminum foil and had lots of panel lines and details. Flew well in the wind



Here is a picture (from the internet) of a couple of large 540 Edges from 3-D Hobby Shop. They manufacture ARF's this size on down to about 31 inches. Flew great in the wind. No problem to hover or make them tail dance—if you are an expert pilot.



OCTOBER FUN FLY

Finally the last Fun Fly of the season and it was a great fall day. It was cool, the sun was shining and the wind was not much of a factor in the flying. With John Woods providing the hotdogs, sodas and chips and Howard Shire doing the cooking honors, everyone had a great lunch to start things off. Even President Dave provided desert in the form of a nice chocolate cake. Actually the cake had a little story to it but we'll skip it for now.

After a short pilots' meeting it was on to the first event which was a TWO MINUTE DRILL. Time starts when plane moves off starting mark, taxi completely around pylon one then completely around pylon two, take off and do a roll then a loop and land. Taxi completely around pylon one and also pylon two, then stop, touching the target, time then stops. No timing help allowed. Penalties are 1 point for each second under 120, 2 points for each second over 120 and 10 points for each pylon displaced. Low points wins. First Place went to Erv Rohde with 111 seconds and 9 points. Second Place was John Woods with 107 seconds (13 points). In Third Place was Fritz Corbin with 131 seconds (22 points) and Fourth was Bud Austin at 158 seconds (76 points).

The second event was HOWARD SHIRE'S EGG DROP. Attach the supplied foam cup to your plane and place a large egg in the cup. Take off, fly to the end of the runway and turn back without dropping the egg (1 point), do a loop without dropping egg (5 points) then fly over target and drop egg. Get 4 points if egg hits runway or 10 points if egg hits inside target area on runway. High points win. No one hit the target area but Bud Austin, Don Johnson and John Woods tied for first at 10 points each. Howard Shire was in Fourth Place with 1 point. After a two to one vote it was decided to have a fly off for first, second and third. With another egg, take off, fly to the end of the runway, turn back and drop the egg. Closest hit to the target wins. First Place went to John Woods, Second Place to Bud Austin and Third to Don Johnson.

The third and final event of 2008 was SPOT LANDING (2). Take off, do a touch-and-go and land on the runway target. Minus 10 points for the touch-and-go and +1 point for each foot away from the target the plane first touches down. Then do it again and take the best score from the two tries. Low score wins. John Woods was on a hot streak and had a touch down of 10' - 6.5", for a net score of 1, and his second First Place of the day. Don Johnson was in Second Place with 16' - 9.5" and a net 7- and Erv Rohde was in Third Place with 17' - 4" and a net 7+. Coming in Third was Fritz Corbin with 19' and a net score of 9. Fritz had the honor of having the last official Fun Fly flight of 2008 and decided to take off again after touching down and ran into a fence post. Bummer!!

The overall winner was John Woods with 270 Top Gun 2008 points. Second Place overall went to Erv Rohde with 165 points and Third overall was Don Johnson with 140 points. In Fourth Place overall was Bud Austin with 120 points.

It has been an interesting year. We got all four of the Fun Flys in. We also had a different overall winner in each of the four Fun Flys and the Top Gun 2008 Award was in doubt until the final event was over. We will probably find out who that skilled pilot is at the November or December meeting. A special thanks to the guest event directors, Howard Shire at this last Fun Fly and John Woods, Bud Austin and Erv Rohde at previous Fun Flys. They provided a welcome diversity to the events. Again many thanks to all those that stepped in to help with the events and the lunches and contributed goodies for the lunches. And also to those that keep the field in such great shape even though there are a bunch of critters trying to dig it up. Great job guys!
