SAFETY FIRST

As we head into colder weather, make sure your batteries are fully charged before heading to the field. Most batteries lose some effectiveness at lower temperatures. You might also consider taking a charger with you and re-charging if your batteries are reading a little low. I have heard some pilot's state that they charged their battery "overnight" and it checks low at the field. It is time for a new battery at that point. I did have a bad charger that fooled me into thinking my battery was bad, so check the charger too. You can also have your buddy check your battery out on his charger just to make sure of the problem.
