TRI-LAKES RC FLYING CLUB DECEMBER 13, 2016

Treasurer Fritz Corbin reported that there was \$1,058.61 in the Treasury as of December 1, 2016. The Treasurer's Report was approved. There being none the Club's Nominating Committee's slate of candidates was voted on and passed. 3. ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP (nonvoting) - \$15 per year.

4. STUDENTS - Free Club membership but must be a current AMA member.

SAFETY FIRST SAFETY RULES & REGULATIONS

I am reviewing the club SAFETY RULES for all members, but in particular for our newer members. These rules will continue to be published every month until they are all listed here. If you can't wait to see them all, e-mail me and I will see that you get a copy.

Please read and comply with the following rules:

The following SAFETY RULES were adopted by the TRI-LAKES R/C FLYING CLUB Membership in October 1997 and revised November 2010.

- All members are expected to know and adhere to the SAFETY RULES set down by the TRI -LAKES R/C FLYING CLUB and the ACAD-EMY OF MODEL AERONAUTICS (AMA) and to use common sense when operating or observing any R/C aircraft.
- Pilots must be insured by the AMA and have in their possession their current AMA identification card.
- Guests of Club members must be AMA members and may use the flying field for a period of two weeks. If guests exceed the twoweek period they will be required to purchase an Associate Membership.
- All models must be identified with the owner's name and address or their AMA number on or in the aircraft.
