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# **BIG, MODERN AND SIMPLE**



Above is our nation's newest fighter, the F-35. Bud Austin, ex Air Force jet jockey, thought it would be nice to fly the new fighter so he downloaded a 3-view of it from the internet and scaled it up to a wing span of 44 inches and length of 65 inches. To build it he went to the home improvement store and bought a sheet of 1/2 inch blue foam board. He tried to stay as close to scale as possible even though it is a profile model. After adding a Turnigy D-3542 1450 Kv motor, 60 amp speed control and a four cell Li-Po battery, the plane had a flying weight of 3.75 pounds. With a 3 blade, MAS 8 X 4 prop it pulls 50 amps and develops 700 watts (0.94 hp) of power. At 187 watts per pound, the plane should hover easily then accelerate straight up! The maiden flight on 1/24/12 showed the plane to be nose heavy. After landing and moving the battery toward the tail it flew much better but broke an elevator clevis on landing. After a few more adjustments the F-35 should turn out to be a great flyer. Bud can be counted on to show up frequently with something different and interesting to fly. Amazing how well an airplane can fly without and airfoil.

It should be ready to fly in a week or so. \* Gene Fuson showed his new E flite Advance 25e ARF. He is powering it with a .32 E flite motor, 3300 mAH 3 cell Li-Po battery with an 80 amp ESC. It should fly very well. \* Bud Austin showed pictures of his ½ inch foam F-35 that he is trying to get trimmed out. Actually he has made two foam jet fighters, the first one escaped and is still at large.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:11 PM.

Above left, Gene Fuson talks about his new E flite Advance 25e ARF. The 25e means it was designed for a 25 size electric motor so naturally Gene installed a 32 size electric motor. He now finds that he needs to add a whole lot of lead in tail area to balance it. So what to do? Get a 25 size motor for the plane or maybe chop the nose off and move the motor back a bit. However the plane looks great and should fly in a spirited manner once Gene gets the CG sorted out. Above right, Don Johnson shows his new Cartoon Mustang. The top, bottom and front are made of vacuformed plastic from a short kit and everything else is from flat Depron 3 or 6 mm foam. Though not flown yet initial tests indicate the recommended 3 cell Li-Po may be overkill and that a 2 cell battery should fly it quite well.

This year we seem to be skipping winter. Several of this winter's days have been very mild and if you can catch a day without much wind, the flying is great. Below left we find John Woods giving some buddy-box help to Bill Walker as he puts in some practice time with his trainer. Bill seems to be doing well on his learning curve. Below right is something bad going to happen. John Woods is giving Howard Shire's Super Sportster a trial flight and just as it lifted off the runway things started to go wrong. The plane decided it wanted to land and tore the wheels off and damaged the armadillo fence. Back in the pits, the post mortem revealed that the servo tray had come loose and it really wasn't John's fault after all. Luckily the plane never got over about four feet off the ground and the damage wasn't really severe. Howard said he was going to glue AND screw the tray down when he repairs it.

# **SAFETY FIRST**

Recently an airplane was found and returned to the Club. After many phone calls and e-mails it was determined who the owner was and the aircraft was returned. This process would have been a lot easier if there had been an owner tag in or on the airplane. It is an AMA rule, and also a Club rule, that YOUR aircraft has an owner identifying tag on it.

Quoting the club rule, "All models must be identified with the owner's name and address or their AMA number on or in the aircraft." I personally can't figure out why anyone would NOT identify their aircraft. If it is lost it makes it a lot easier to return your expensive airplane to you. I usually put <u>two</u> owner tags on my airplanes, one inside the fuselage, and one on the outside of the airplane.
