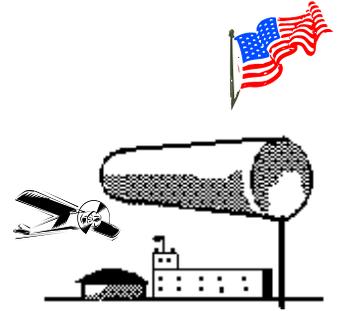

## TRI-LAKES R/C FLYING CLUB MARCH 10, 2009

The meeting was called to order by President Bud Austin at 5:59 P.M. at the Branson RecPlex.

All officers were present. There were 12 members present including the Officers. There were also two guests, Claudia Shire and Janet Woods.

### Committee Reports

Erv. Rhode reported that we had \$2,727.58 on hand. Reeder Jones won the 50/50 raffle. He collected \$5.50, half of the \$11.00 collected.

### Old Business

Howard Shire reported that there was nothing in the minutes over the last 5 years that said we would change the combination on the gate each year. Annette McEvoy made a motion that the combination on the gate be changed every year. Seconded by Don Johnson. The motion was amended to read "the combination of the lock on the main gate should be changed on or about the first of March each year". Motion carried. As a follow up to last month's blockbuster front page story of the U.S. Lightening Volt and its role in the D-Day invasion, the British also developed a parallel electric attack aircraft code named the Spitwire. It too was seen by some as it silently flashed along the beaches of Normandy wreaking havoc on the Axis lines. The six plane squadron of Spitwires were carried aloft and released over the beaches by a trio of Hampton bombers. They were armed with six .303 machine guns. Unfortunately they all met the same fate as their American allies and fell into the water just short of the White Cliffs of Dover, never to be heard about again-till now. Will it fly? Darn tootin' it will fly! Above is Don Johnson's scratch designed and built 1/12 scale Ballanca Aircruiser, on its maiden flight with Chief Test Pilot John Woods on the sticks. At just under 3 pounds and with a 65 inch span, it proved to be a fairly gentle flyer.

**When? April 18th**  
**BBQ starts at noon**  
**Pilot's meeting at 1 PM**  
There will be three events.

**Event 1. TIMED FLIGHT with LOOPS & ROLLS(2)** Take off and do a loop followed by a roll as many times as possible in a 60 second flight. Timing starts when plane moves and stops when plane stops. Pilot will receive 5 points for each decent loop & roll (judges decision) and 1 point penalty for each second off the 60 second mark. There will also be a 20 point penalty if the plane stops totally off the runway. Pilot CAN NOT receive timing help. High score wins.

**Event 2. ERV'S 6 GROUND TARGETS** Time starts when you touch starting line between two targets. Knock over 2 targets, come back and knock over one starting line target. Continue to knock over 2 more targets, then back to the starting line. Knock over remaining starting line target and clock stops.

Penalties:

5 seconds if you break a piece. 2 pieces.

10 seconds if you get airborne.

15 seconds if you destroy a stick; more than 2 pieces.

20 seconds if you don't follow the rules.

**ONE WITH LEAST SECONDS WINS.**

**Event 3. TIMED TOUCH & GO LANDINGS** Make five touch and go landings in the shortest possible time. All take-offs and landings will be made into the wind or as indicated by the event director. One landing per pass. At least one main landing gear wheel must touch the runway to be counted as a landing. Wing tip touches will not be counted as landings. Timing will start when the throttle is opened for take-off and will stop at touch down after the fifth take-off has been completed. The shortest time will determine the winner. A four-minute time limit is placed on the event. No engine re-starts are allowed. Novices will be required to do only 3 touch and go landings.

Pilots can use any fixed wing aircraft they want in any event.
