

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BIG, AND ELECTRIC, IS BEAUTIFUL



Bud Austin is the proud owner of the biggest and baddest electric in the Club. It is a Nitro Katana 140 and weighs in at about 10 1/2 pounds. It is powered with a Turnigy 6364-280 electric outrunner motor and Turnigy 6 cell 5000 mAH Li-Po battery. It uses a Hobby King Super Simple SS 90/100 speed control without BEC as it has a separate battery to power the receiver and servos. Bud says the Katana will go vertical on a fresh battery and that under normal flight conditions it will fly for about 10 minutes. It is a little surprising to see this big plane fly by without the sound of a big gas or glo engine. Well done Bud!

THE EDITOR'S NOTE PAD

Time for a few statistics. The Club now has 20 members, two less than this time last year. There are 19 regular members, 18 of which reside in Stone county and one member resides in Taney county. We have one Associate member in Marionville, no family members and no student members. Seems as though the Club base has moved west in the last few years. During 2009 we had 23 members that attended at least one meeting and six members that attended no meetings. The lowest attendance was in June with seven members present and highest attendance was in December (Christmas party) with 18 members present. The average meeting attendance was 11.4 members or about 39%. In the four Fun Flys during 2009, eight total members competed, two competed in one Fun Fly, one in one Fun Fly, three in two Fun Flys and two competed in all four Fun Flys. We had an average of 5.25 members competing for Top Gun 2009 in each Fun Fly. The Club presently has a healthy treasury. The flying field is in great shape due to some dedicated members. It is a good flying site, albeit a little less flat and treeless than some would like, but still a good place to fly. We also have a current and professional web site and a long running monthly newsletter. But we have the same problem as most other clubs do today and that is keeping their membership at a healthy level. So, it is in every members' best interest to put forth the effort to find and recruit mew members

A couple of weeks ago President Dave Medley called and said the AMA had responded to his request for TAG funds and awarded the Club \$300. This should help us in our recruiting efforts. Atta way to go Dave!

Hopefully with the Tech Center's advertising he will get several students to sign up. This may turn out to be a great Club recruiting tool. With 18 hours of instruction John will probably appreciate help from other Club members either on particular topics or showing different types of aircraft......ed.

Radio Control Model Airplane Class By John Woods

This coming fall, around October, I'll be teaching a class at the Gibson Tech Center about R/C Airplanes. I enjoy teaching (and making a few bucks too) and through this class, we as a Club may pick up a few members. The class is geared for the beginner as an introduction to our hobby. Selecting the correct plane, motors and engines, various characteristics for a variety of planes, building opportunities (Kits, ARFs, RTFs, BNFs), proper set-up, and safety concerns along with general costs associated with R/C will be covered.

New vs. Old Radio technologies available as well as Fueled and Electric models will be discussed. I'll have my Flight Simulator available at each class so students may try their hand at flying. I'll invite them to come to our field to watch us fly but will not offer to let them fly – possibly later.

Gibson Tech Center is in Reeds Spring near the corner of 76 & 413. I ask about using the gymnasium next door and the director said we could use the gym if it is available. This would be helpful to be able to demo some indoor planes. I'll have use of a projector and be able to go on-line to check out some of the more popular sites for supplies, training help and information. The High School football field is also available and Gibson owns the air strip across the street that some of you flew at many years ago - lots of possibilities.

The class will be 6 weeks, one 3 hour class per

week. If the class seems successful I can do another class in the spring. I plan on having those who would like to participate to bring in one or two models for about an hour discussion at each class. That way the class can see the variety of planes that are available and be able to ask questions. I'll talk to the local hobby stores and contact some of the vendors to get brochures for hand outs as well as the AMA.

If you have any ideas, let me know. I have talked to Mike Anderson and Keith Oxby who have taught at Gibson and appreciate their help and suggestions. Of course all this is pending students signing up so it all may not happen – just have to go for it.

When? April 17th BBQ starts at noon Pilot's meeting at 1 PM

There will be three events.

Event 1. TIMED FLIGHT with LOOPS & ROLLS(2) Take off and do a loop followed by a roll as many times as possible in a 60 second flight. Timing starts when plane moves and stops when plane stops. Pilot will receive 5 points for each decent loop & roll (judges decision) and 1 point penalty for each second off the 60 second mark. There will also be a 20 point penalty if the plane stops totally off the runway. Pilot <u>CAN NOT</u> receive timing help. High score wins.

Event 2. ERV'S 6 GROUND TARGETS Time starts when you touch starting line between two targets. Knock over 2 targets, come back and knock over one starting line target. Continue to knock over 2 more targets, then back to the starting line. Knock over remaining starting line target and clock stops. Penalties:

5 seconds if you break a piece. 2 pieces.

10 seconds if you get airborne.

15 seconds if you destroy a stick; more than 2 pieces.

20 seconds if you don't follow the rules.

ONE WITH LEAST SECONDS WINS.

Event 3. TIMED TOUCH & GO LANDINGS Make five touch and go landings in the shortest possible time. All take-offs and landings will be made into the wind or as indicated by the event director. One landing per pass. At least one main landing gear wheel must touch the runway to be counted as a landing. Wing tip touches will not be counted as landings. Timing will start when the throttle is opened for take-off and will stop at touch down after the fifth take-off has been completed. The shortest time will determine the winner. A four-minute time limit is placed on the event. Engine restarts are allowed. Novices will be required to do only 3 touch and go landings.

Pilots can use any fixed wing aircraft they want in any event.
