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THE PRESIDENT'S CORNER

As I write this Janet and I are still in Florida. Janet will have her last treatment March 28 then we will be heading back home the following day arriving home on April 4. Janet is doing really good. Her CA125 tests are in the normal range and seem to be stable. I'll keep you informed as we go through this.

I have joined two RC Clubs here. One Club is 14 miles away and has a huge field and no trees. The other Club is 4 miles away and has a small field with lots of trees. I fly my MX2 at the one without all the obstacles and my electrics at the smaller field. This year there has been a lot of wind so actually haven't flown much...... still enjoy being here though.

Last week, a friend here in the camp and I went to see an F3B AMA Sanctioned glider competition held at one of the Clubs I've joined. The F3B Gliders are made of carbon composite with a wing span of 114". This was an international event and consisted of three types of flying. Speed, Glide and Spot Landing and Duration. We watched the Speed event which starts with a winch launch up to around 600' elevation then the pilot would loop the planes straight down entering the course. They would enter around 110MPH, fly 4 laps over a 500' course and the best time won. Times range from 15 to 20 seconds - really fast. The event is not very popular for spectators so most of the people there were pilots and their support group. It is a very high pressure event and not for everyone. The planes We enjoyed seeing the are around \$1,000. event. Next weekend the Club will host an Aero-Tow event using the monster Gliders.

Last week end we went to a full scale air show held just across from our camp ground. It is sponsored by a local museum and airfield. The event, TICO Air Show, draws around 5,000 people and was really good. Lots of planes to see – aerobatic, war birds, jets and even FIFI, the B29 flew in from Texas and participated all week end. Sky divers and lots of bombs going off during the bombing exercise. It was pretty noisy at camp when about 4 of the old War Birds would fly over. Lots of fun.

Hope all of you are doing OK and were able to get a few days of flying over the last several months. Looking forward to flying again at our field.

APRIL 16TH FUN FLY FIRST EVENT WILL START AT 11:00 AM BBQ AFTER THE Fun Fly

There will be three events.

Event 1. TIME AND PLACE. From the square, take off and do a loop, land and stop in square (at least two wheels) in exactly 30 seconds. Then take off and do a roll, turn off the engine/motor (at least six feet above ground) and stop plane in the square. Restarts OK. One point for each second plus or minus 30 seconds and one point for each foot the plane stops from center of square. Low score wins.

Event 2. BUD'S LOOPS & ROLLS Take off from the marked area (circle or square) and do a loop and a roll. Do a touch and go and another loop and roll, another touch and go and loop and roll. Then land and stop with at least one wheel in the marked area. Total time in seconds is your score, lowest score wins. All takeoffs and landings must be in the same direction. 20 second penalty for each air maneuver missed. Disqualification for failure to do the required touch and goes. You may do the loop and roll in any order.

Event 3. BUMPER POOL. Take off from square, do a loop and land in same direction as takeoff, dislodge yellow cone from mark (with plane). Take off, do a roll and land in same direction as take off, dislodge red cone from mark and stop plane with at least one wheel in square. Low time wins. Restarts allowed with time continuing to run.

Pilots can fly any fixed wing aircraft in any event.
