

Always inspect your propeller before first use, and after each flight, for splits, cracks, or other wear or damage. This is especially important after a not so perfect landing. Most of us look at the ends of the prop, but how many look closely at the hub area? Discard that prop if it is less than perfect. Consider painting the tips for better visibility when the prop is turning..

# MEETING MINUTES

## TRI-LAKES R/C FLYING CLUB

April 10, 2007

Vice President Dave Medley opened the meeting at 7:03 p.m. at the Branson Rec Plex. All officers were present except Gary Acton. There were 12 members present, no new members or guests attended. The minutes from the March meeting were approved as published in the April Newsletter. Treasurer Erv Rohde reported that the treasury balance as of April 1<sup>st</sup> was \$2148.60. The 50/50 raffle was won by John Woods who received one half of \$11.00.

### **Committee Reports:**

Fritz Corbin advised that the armadillos have been active again and asked that everyone try to fill in any holes they notice on the landing strip. There is dirt by the shed.

Fritz also announced that he will be sending out a revised ops plan for the upcoming Ladies Fun Fly. John, Erv, Bud and Joe will each be doing a 3 to 4 minute demo during the lunch break.

### **Announcements and Old Business:**

Concerns regarding the weather for this weekend's Fun Fly were discussed. It was decided that CD Don Johnson and Safety Officer Gene Fuson will make a determination by Friday and notify members via email if the event will be postponed until the following weekend, April 21<sup>st</sup>. John Woods will be getting the food for the event, Dave Medley and Bob Pilecki will handle the cooking chores.

### **New Business:**

Bud Austin advised that his church has a group interested in flying and asked if we were interested in hosting a flying event or some sort of demonstration for them. Dave Medley said that he also had the same ques-

tion regarding the boys ranch "Lives Under Construction Ranch". After general discussion both Bud and Dave will coordinate with each organization as to what future dates may be mutually agreeable to have an event and advise at the next meeting.

Erv Rohde announced that we have a new one year lease with Brenda Oswald. There is a clause that allows for a 90 day notice of cancellation by either party. The lease is effective from 3/1/07 through 2/28/08.

John Woods said that he picked up the 36" 11 HP Hydrostatic Drive Craftsman mower and asked that Annette McEvoy send a thank you card. John also has information on an upcoming June 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Float Fly. Anyone interested should contact him.

### **Program:**

Don Johnson gave a very informative presentation on the "Care and Feeding of Batteries & Other Stuff". His handout had a lot of information including definitions, recommendations as to what tools you really need to properly check your equipment and comparisons of Nicads, Nickel Metal Hydrides, Li-pos and Lithium-ion batteries. He also had detailed information on chargers and charging rates to use. Along with the "rules of thumb" he had on the handouts he fielded many questions from the members. It was not only interesting but very enlightening presentation.

Gene Fuson brought his latest addition, an Electrify Fokker D7 complete with Snoopy. It features a Berg 7 channel receiver and Castle ESC. It's covered in an attractive red and white color scheme.

Next meeting will be May 8<sup>th</sup> at Rocky Top.

# APRIL FUN FLY

It was very windy but the April Fun Fly had been postponed the week before due to wind and rain, so no one even thought of canceling out. After a lunch of hot dogs, sodas, chips, beans and several other high calorie goodies, it was on with the pilots meeting and into the first event.

The first event was a Timed Flight With Loops and Rolls. Take off, do as many loop roll combinations as you can and land in exactly 90 seconds. Five points for every acceptable loop-roll combination and minus 1 point for each second off the 90 second required flight time. Minus 20 points for stopping off the field. Time starts when the plane moves and stops when the plane stops. Highest score wins. Bud Austin was first with 11 loop-roll combos and an 18 second penalty for a score of 37 (55-18). Erv Rohde was second with a score of 32 (45-13) and Fritz Corbin was third with 9 (45-16-20). Fritz took a little trip into the weeds on landing but still would have been in third place without the -20 penalty. Don Johnson was fourth with a 0 (20-0-20). Fifth place was Dave Medley with -15 (15-29) and John Woods was sixth with -52 (10-42-20). John did a couple of combos and then it looked like his Russian pilot had been shot as the plane staggered around then dove into the trees. Howard Shire had a DNF when his plane quit before completing any combos. His plane had a hard landing so he was out for the day.

The next event was Erv Rohde's Three Loop event. Take off, do three perfect consecutive loops, then land. The loops were judged by 5 non flying judges (mostly wives) with each judge scoring the three loops from 1 to 10. The pilot with the highest combined score of the judges wins. Erv Rohde was first with a score of 39. John Woods was second with 36 and Bud Austin was third with 30. Fritz Corbin was fourth with 21. Don Johnson was

fifth but didn't complete the event because his wing collapsed. No other planes attempted the event.

The last event was the Box Event. Place or taxi the plane into a marked square on the field. Take off, fly a 360 around the field, land and taxi into the square and stop with at least two wheels in the square. Take off again, do a 360 and land and stop in the square with at least two wheels inside the square. Time starts when the plane moves out of the square the first time and stops when the plane stops in the square the second time. Maximum time allowed is 4 minutes. Low score wins. Erv Rohde was first with 56 seconds. Second place went to Bud Austin with 58 second and third was John Woods at 60 seconds. Fourth place was Fritz Corbin with 140 second and fifth was Don Johnson with 142 seconds.

Overall results were First Place, Erve Rohde with 270 Top Gun 2007 points. Second Place was Bud Austin with 220 points and John Woods was Third with 130 points. Fourth Place went to Fritz Corbin with 110 points and Fifth to Don Johnson with 70 points. The wind was a problem with all events and probably did have some effect on some of the results—at least it made each event more difficult.

Many thanks to John Woods for providing the hot dogs, sodas and chips and Dave Medley for being the chef for the day. Also thanks to those that brought the extras—bean soup, cookies, cobbler, brownies and donut holes, etc. Also thanks to Erv Rohde for providing a unique Fun Fly event and for everyone else that helped with scoring and putting on the events.

The date for the June Fun Fly is not certain at this point because of some conflicting schedules but should be determined at the May Meeting.
