MEETING MINUTES

TRI-LAKES RC FLYING CLUB

APRIL 10, 2018

President John Woods opened the meeting at 5:37 PM, at the South Port Condo Clubhouse. There were 6 members present including all officers. Guest Greg Armstrong joined the Club during the meeting and was one of the 6 members. Treasurer Fritz Corbin reported that there was \$1,444.49 in the Treasury as of March 1, 2018. The Treasurer's Report was approved. The Minutes of the December meeting were approved as written in the January Newsletter. There were no Club Meetings in January, February and March of 2018. The 50/50 raffle was won by John Woods and he received \$4.50 of the \$9 pot.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: President John Woods talked about the Club's need to gain more members. He said some of the Nixa flyers could join our Club if they lose their field due to housing developments. He also has talked to all members that are behind in the dues and feels Jimmy Cardenzana and Gary Merseal will re-up as the weather gets better and maybe Howard Shire will rejoin if he gets feeling better.

OLD BUSINESS: When leaving the field and locking up, the combination lock (the club combination lock) should connect the last empty link of the chain and the lock on the other end of the chain. See pictures in the April Newsletter.

GATE ETIQUETTE



When opening the Club field gate swing it all the way open and place it on the concrete block. This will take the strain off the gate post and help it from sagging. Also when opening the lock, change the numbers so the combination is not visible when it is unlocked.



When you are the last to leave the field you need to lock the gate. The Club's lock is lock 1. Lock 2 belongs to the power company so they can get in to read the meter. Not sure about lock 3, maybe the owners. Lock 1 goes through the last link in the chain and lock 2. In this way opening either lock 1 or lock 2 will open the gate. If the lock does not snap closed, twirl the combination and try again. **Do not leave the gate unlocked!**






Test Pilot, John Woods, checking out Greg's plane on its' maiden flight. This foam board plane was made from Flite-Test.com plans.

APRIL 2018 FUN FLY

The first FUN Fly of 2018 got off to a late start, one week late, due to bad weather. It was still a little windy but there were four pilots ready to give it a go.

The first event was TOUCH AND GOES. Take off. Time starts when plane moves. Do as many touch and goes as possible in exactly 2 minutes. All touches must be on the runway in front of the judges and in the same direction. Only one touch per approach counts. Most touches wins. First place was a tie with six touches each by Bud Austin and John Woods. In third place was Don Johnson with five touches and Fritz Corbin with four touches.

The second event was BUD'S Maximum loops in exactly 2 minutes. Take off and do as many loops as you can in 2 minutes. Time starts when the plane moves and stops when the plane stops. 10 points for each loop. Minus 1 point for each second you are over or under 2 minutes. No timing help. The rules for this event allowed a little unexpected strategy. Fritz was first up and made nine loops in 164 seconds receiving a 44 second penalty and net score of 46 and finished fourth. John was up next and did 30 loops in 127 seconds getting a 7 second penalty and a net score of 293 and third place. Next was Bud and he did 37 loops in 175 seconds earning a 55 second penalty resulting in a net score of 315 and third place. Last up was Don and he made 46 loops in 211 seconds getting a 91 second penalty but a net score of 369 and a first place. If this event is run again maybe counting loops should stop at 120 seconds.

The last event was TENNIS ANYONE? There will be three unrestrained tennis balls in the 6 foot circle. Take off from the circle (time starts when plane moves) and land in the same direction as take off and park the plane in the circle (two wheels must be in the circle or if plane has no wheels, 50% of the plane must be in the circle). The transmitter must be in the pilot station any time it is used to move the aircraft. The pilot must go to the circle and retrieve one tennis ball and place it in the pilot station. Repeat sequence for each of the two remaining tennis balls. Time stops when the third tennis ball is on the ground in the pilot station. There will be a 10 second penalty for each tennis ball blown or kicked out of the circle. Pilot may place tennis balls any place in the circle before take off. Pilot must place any tennis ball outside of the circle back in the circle before takeoff or before picking it up and placing it in the pilot station. Low net time wins. Even reducing the parking area from a 10 foot square last October to a 6 foot circle didn't result in any penalties from any tennis balls being blown out or kicked out of the area. John was back on his game with a time of 169 seconds and a first place. Bud was in second place with 212 seconds and Fritz was third with 242 seconds. Don was a DNF. Without a steerable tail wheel the wind did not allow his foamy to turn into the circle.

The Overall winner was John with 235 Top Gun 2018 points and a First place. Second Overall went to Bud with 225 Top Gun points. Don was Third with 160 points and Fritz was Fourth with 110 points.

Many thanks to everyone that helped with this Fun Fly, especially Janet Woods, who cooked the dogs and brought a special cake to celebrate Isaac Thomas' birthday.

Our next Fun Fly is scheduled for June 16th.
