

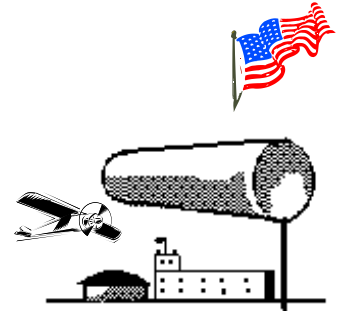

JUNE FUN FLY

It was a nice summer day but the wind was gusting which didn't bode well for some of the intrepid pilots. After a short pilots meeting it was 11 AM and time for the first event.

The first event was a **FIVE LAP PYLON RACE + A HOP**. From the square taxi five circuits around the pylons then take off without delay and do a loop or roll (HOP). Time starts when plane moves and stops when plane passes the square the fifth time. During the taxi a 10 second penalty will be assessed each time all three wheels are clearly off the ground or a pylon is knocked over. Failure to do the HOP will add 100 seconds to the time. Low time wins. John Woods showed the way with a time of 59 seconds and no penalties. Second place went to Erv Rohde with 72 seconds and Third place was a tie between Bud Austin and Jim Haney at 78 seconds. Bud's time included a 10 second pylon penalty. Fifth place went to Greg Moody with 117 seconds.

The second event was **BUD'S 60 SECONDS OF LOOPS**. Maximum Loops in 60 Seconds . Take off from marked square. Do as many loops as possible and land and stop in square in 60 second or less. 2 points for each loop completed. Minus 1 point for each second over 60. Time starts when airplane moves and stops when plane stops with any wheel in the square. Highest score wins. This was hard fought with Bud Austin and John Woods tying for first place with 16 points. Bud had 9 loops less a 2 second penalty and John had 10 loops less a 4 second penalty. Third place went to Jim Haney with 6 loops and a 3 second penalty for a score of 9. Fourth place went to Erv Rohde with a 4 (8 loops—12 seconds) and Fifth place was Don Johnson with a minus 7 (10

loops minus 27 seconds).

The last event was **TWO MINUTES OF T & G'S**. Take off. Time starts when plane moves. Do as many T & G's as possible in 120 seconds. Most T & G's win. Both Bud and John were on a roll and tied for First place with 7T & G's. In Third place was Jim Haney with 4 T & G's, Fourth place went to Erv Rohde with 3 T & G's and Fifth place was Greg Moody with 2 T & G's.

The Overall winner with 270 Top Gun 2012 points was John Woods. In Second place with 210 points was Bud Austin, Third was Jim Haney at 140 points and Fourth was Erv Rohde with 130 points. Fifth place went to Greg Moody with 50 points and tied for sixth was Don Johnson and Howard shire at 30 points .

We had 7 enter into this Fun Fly, including Jim Haney and Greg Moody who competed in a Fun Fly for the first time. They both managed to place in a couple of the events. Great job guys, well done!

Would like to thank Bud Austin for his LOOPS event, Gene Fuson for running the scoring and all the guys that helped him time, count and keep track of things during the events. Also thanks to Jim Haney for getting the grub and Janet Woods for being the chef for the BBQ. Janet didn't bring a lemon cake like she usually did, but she brought a Chocolate cake instead which was equally as good. Last but not least, thanks to Bud Austin and Fritz Corbin for having the flying field in such good shape.

The next scheduled Fun Fly will be August 18th. Hope to see you there.

SAFETY FIRST

Earlier this year, April 2012, we saw a lot of crashes. Some of these crashes seem to result from having lost contact with the airplane. In other words, no good reason for that airplane to crash. A couple of years ago, I sent my radio in to be checked out after having a couple of "unexplained" crashes with the same radio. The repair shop didn't say if anything was wrong with the radio, but it seems to operate good now.

That is not to say that it couldn't be the receiver or transmitter battery, because that can and does happen.

Batteries are easy to check out, radio problems are not.

If you even suspect that something may be wrong with your radio, send it in to be checked. The cost will usually be around \$50, but you will get a radio that has been checked out, and most importantly some "peace of mind"
