## **MEETING MINUTES**

#### **TRI-LAKES RC FLYING CLUB**

#### JULY 9, 2013

Secretary Don Johnson opened the meeting at 6:01 PM, at the Club flying field. President Greg Moody and Vice-President Gene Fuson were absent. There were 9 members present including the Officers. The split the pot raffle was won by Don Johnson, and he received \$4.00 of the \$8.00 pot. There were no guests or new members present. The minutes of the June meeting were approved as printed in the July Newsletter.

**Committee Reports:** Treasurer Roy Steinestel reported the Club had \$1,836.17 in the bank as of July 1<sup>st</sup>.

**Old Business:** Tabled from last month, and after further discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed that the Club donate \$100 to the Wounded Warrior program. Roy Steinestel will send them a check.

**New Business:** John Woods ordered a box (24 rolls) of Blenderm tape which he said should be delivered in a couple of days. He said he would sell about 10 rolls for \$2 each to any one that wanted them. Great stuff for small plane hinges.

Howard Shire suggested that we drop trying to have the Boy Scouts and LUC Boys Ranch to the Club flying field this year for a flight demo unless they request it. The members present were in agreement with this suggestion.

Fritz Corbin donated a new (used) BBQ to the Club and John Woods sold the old BBQ for scrap and gave the money to the Club. This was much appreciated guys. Fritz reported that he had seen very little evidence of armadillos this year, however the electric fence is still on and working.

It was moved, seconded and passed that the August Fun Fly be dedicated to the National Model Aviation Day.

It was suggested that if the temperature was forecast to be over 90 degrees, that the meeting be held at the Southport Clubhouse, which has air conditioning. The sweating Club members present thought this was a good idea.

It was reported that Homer Zobel had visited the field the previous Saturday and was thinking of rejoining the Club. Homer has been absent from the field for the last two or three years and we look forward to his rejoining the Club.

The crash trophy was not awarded this month since the trophy and current owner were not at the meeting.

**Program:** Erv Rohde brought a Laser 200 that his son had built and flown. It had a 97 inch wingspan and was 73 inches long. It weighed 18 pounds without engine or flight gear. Erv wanted to auction it off but when the bids stalled out at about \$50 everyone

### AUGUST 17TH FUN FLY FIRST EVENT WILL START AT 11:00 AM BBQ AFTER THE Fun Fly

There will be three events.

**Event 1.** SPEEDY GONZALES Put plane on plate on runway and Take off. Time starts when plane moves. Do a roll, do a roll and loop, then do two loops, then land and get plane (stopped) on plate. Time stops when plane stops while touching plate. Shortest time wins. Twenty point penalty for not completing any of the three maneuvers satisfactorily—judges decision. Failure to complete event in 3 minutes results in disqualification.

**Event 1. ERV'S GROUND TARGETS** NEED A PLANE WITH STEERABLE WHEEL. TIME STARTS WHEN PLANE TOUCHES STARTING LINE. OBJECT: KNOCK DOWN 5 TARGETS WITH WING, THEN TIME STOPS WHEN YOU TOUCH FINISH LINE. SHORTEST TIME WINS. PENALTYS; 1 BREAK A TARGET, 5 SECONDS. 2 WHEELS LEAVE GROUND, 10 SECONDS. 3 DE-STROY A TARGET WITH PROP, 20 SECONDS.

Event 3. CLIMB, GLIDE & SPOT LANDING WITH LOOP. The pilot will be allowed a 20 second motor run after lift off from ground or release from hand launch. At 20 seconds the pilot will shut off the engine/motor and glide to a spot landing. Total time will be from take off or launch to landing (stop). Pilot must do a loop sometime during the flight. If the motor continues to run the flight will be disqualified. Penalties: Minus 1 second for each foot away from the target, minus 60 seconds for not doing a loop and minus 50 seconds if plane lands (stops) totally off the runway. Longest NET flight time wins!

Pilots can use any fixed wing aircraft they want in any event.
