AUGUST FUN FLY

The weatherman said light winds but it was a little blustery during the Fun Fly but nothing the four brave pilots couldn't handle. After a short pilots meeting it was off to the first event. The flying order was determined by how the pilot finished in the last Fun Fly. So John Woods led off in the First event.

The first event was AIR AND GROUND From the square (time starts when plane moves) Taxi a complete 360 around the red pylon, taxi through the square and do a 360 around the yellow pylon then come to a complete stop with the plane wholly within the square. Take off and do a loop, land and stop with no part of the aircraft overhanging the square lines. Time stops when plane stops. Low time wins. Penalties 15 seconds for becoming airborne while taxiing and 15 seconds for any pylon being moved. John Woods was first up and turned in the lowest time with 56 seconds. Bud Austin came in second with a 73 that included a 15 second penalty for moving a pylon. In third place was Fritz Corbin with 94 seconds and Don Johnson was fourth with a 160, which included a penalty for hitting a pylon. This event turned out to be quite difficult due to some of the technical terms used in the directions, like 360 and stop.

The next event was John's Touch-n-Go-n-Loop-n-Roll: Start from Box outlined on the field. Time starts. Do a Touch-n-Go in the same direction as you took off. After the Touch-n-Go do a Loop-n-Roll. Land in the same direction as you took off. Taxi and stop the plane in the Box. Time Stops. Lowest time wins. In first place in this event was Bud with 51 seconds. Fritz came in second with a close 53 and John, in his event, came in third with a 58. Don Johnson, with a squirrely plane, came in fourth with 70

seconds.

The last event was 90 X 8s In exactly 90 seconds do as many figure eights as possible. Time starts when plane moves. Center of the eights is to be in front of the judging station. Eights can be vertical or horizontal. Eights need not be perfectly shaped but must be recognizable (judges decision). Most acceptable eights wins. John got back in his winning ways with 7 1/2 figure eights. Coming in a close second was Fritz with 7 eights. Bud was third with 5 1/2 eights and Don was fourth again with 5 eights. This event was simple for everyone but it seemed difficult to keep focused for the whole 90 seconds.

First place overall winner was John Woods with 250 Top Gun 2017 points. In second place was Fritz Corbin with 220 points and third place went to Bud Austin with 190 points. Don Johnson was very consistent with his fourth place finish and 90 points.

As always thanks to Fritz and Bud for having the field in such great shape. To John for bringing the grub and Janet for cooking the dogs and bringing her lemon cake. We also thank our enthusiastic gallery which included Joy Austin and Dave and Val Medley. Val also brought some yummy short-bread cookies. Obviously we enjoy all the attention we can get!

The next scheduled Fun Fly is Octobrt 14th.

SAFETY FIRST

Crosswind takeoffs can be dangerous if you are not experienced. The most hazardous takeoff situation is with the wind at your back and you are taking off right to left. This creates a situation known as "Weather-veining."

This situation is even worse if you are flying a "Tail-dragger." If your experience is limited, avoid this hazardous situation if at all possible. Waiting for awhile, until the wind calms down, or even until another day, may be the safe thing to do.
