# **MEETING MINUTES**

# TRI-LAKES R/C FLYING CLUB September 12, 2006

President Gary Acton opened the meeting at 7:02 p.m. at Rocky Top Field. All officers were present. There were 13 members present. One member's wife, Claudia Shire, was in attendance. The minutes from the August meeting were approved as published in the September Newsletter. Treasurer Erv Rohde reported that the treasury balance as of September 1<sup>st</sup> was \$1,228.54. The 50/50 raffle was won by Don Johnson who received one half of \$12.

Committee Reports: Comments were made to Bud Austin regarding how nice the field looked. Bud reported that both mowers were running and that one of the hoods was damaged. Tom McKenzie thinks that he may have one that would fit and will check into it.

Announcements and Old Business: Safety officer, John Woods, reported that Paul Denny got hit in the throat by a prop. Fortunately he wasn't badly hurt and reminded everyone once again about being careful around our planes.

Gary Acton reported that Roscoe Fudge has stepped down as Fun Fly Director. Considerable discussion took place regarding Fun Fly events and what members expect from them.. It was agreed that communication as to exactly what is expected of the contestants for each event is the biggest concern. John Woods handed out fun fly charts that have been used in the past and could be used as a guide which clearly shows what a pilot is supposed to do to obtain maximum results. Motion was made, 2<sup>nd</sup> and passed unanimously to have Don Johnson take over as Fun Fly Director for the final October event. New Director for 2007 to be announced.

Gary Acton said that he and wife Lisa were still looking for something to hand out to hospitalized kids and others for Christmas, preferably airplane related. The general discussion regarding what we could to do as a group ended up with agreeing to have all members who wish to participate bring a (new) teddy bear to the November meeting. Gary will find out who to contact at the hospital and find out what is the best way to present them. He will let us know next month.

John Woods gave a report on the Tablerock Health-care presentation that Club members put on, September 8. The event was a real success and enjoyed by both the members and the residents of the facility. A general discussion followed among all members regarding this and other events that could be put on in the future. It is agreed that we would like to hold more of these public service type of events and anyone who knows of a group that may be interested in us doing something like this for them should let us know.

He has a very detailed "Ops" plan that is available for all interested parties with complete details. Joe Major will be on standby as a third Intro Pilot if needed and Bud Austin will take care of the cooking chores. Erv Rohde was asked to have the port-a-john serviced.

New Business: There was no new business.

**Program:** Bud Austin handed out the certificates from the August fun fly event. There was a three way first place tie between John Woods, Howard Shire and Bud Austin for the Carrier Landing event. Fritz Corbin received his certificate for 1<sup>st</sup> place in the Egg Drop event. 1<sup>st</sup> overall was a three way tie between John, Howard & Bud.

# When? October 14th BBQ starts at noon—pilot's meeting at 1 PM Where? Rocky Top Field There will be three or four events.

**Event 1. ERV's GOLF** Pilot draws number 30 to 60, gives to Timer 1, only Timer 1 knows number and sets timer to count down from that number. Pilot now takes off. When plane is airborne, Timer 1 starts clock counting down. [Pilot is now flying plane in the air] When Timer sees clock is down to 3 seconds, Timer 1 yells to pilot 3-2-1,{LAND}. When Timer 2 hears the word [LAND}, Timer 2 starts clock that's counting up. Pilot lands plane on earth. When engine is off, TX is off, & RX is off, Pilot yells {OFF} Timer 2 stops clock. Now that is his/her time plus golf score. The rush is over. Pilot goes to golf range, TEES up ball behind marker, Hits ball with 7 iron to can. Measure from ball to can. Any part of ball touching can (within I/16"), add 0 seconds, Add 1 second for each foot away from the can. Penalties: 1. Any part of plane touching earth before Timer 1 yells {LAND} 30 seconds. 2. Anypilot not following rules 20 seconds. 3. Any pilot not turning off engine, RX, or TX, 20 seconds for each. 4. Any pilot griping 30 seconds. Low score wins.

**Event 2**. Timed Touch & Goes. Make four touch and go landings in the marked rectangle, in the shortest possible time. All take-offs and landings will be made into the wind or in a direction indicated by the event director. At least one main landing gear wheel must touch in the square to be counted as a landing. Wing tip touches will not be counted as landings. Timing will start when the throttle is opened for take-off and will stop at touch down after the fourth take-off has been completed. The shortest time will determine the winner. A three minute time limit is placed on the event.

**Event 3.** CLIMB, GLIDE & SPOT LANDING WITH LOOP. The pilot will be allowed a 20 second motor run after lift off from ground or release from hand launch. At 20 seconds the pilot will shut off the motor and glide to a spot landing. Total time will be from take off or launch to landing (stop). Pilot must do a loop sometime during the flight. If the motor continues to run the flight will be disqualified. Penalties: Minus 1 second for each foot away from the target, minus 60 seconds for not doing a loop and minus 50 seconds if plane lands (stops) totally off the runway. Longest NET flight time wins!

**Event 4.** TIMED SPOT LANDING. Take off. Time starts when the plane starts moving. Do a loop and a roll or roll and a loop, then immediately stop motor. Dead stick land on runway target. Time stops when plane stops. One point for each second of flight and I point for each foot away from the target. Lowest points wins. Penalty 30 seconds for delayed motor stop. Landing (stopping) totally off the runway or not doing the required loop and roll is a DQ.

Alternate TIMED FLIGHT WITH LOOPS & ROLLS- Take off and do a loop followed by a roll as many times as possible in a 60 seconds flight. Timing starts when plane moves and stops when plane stops. Pilot will receive 5 points for each decent loop & roll (judges decision) and 1 point penalty for each second off the 60 second mark. There will also be a 20 point penalty if the plane stops totally off the runway. Pilot can receive timing help. High score wins

Pilots can use any fixed wing aircraft they want in any event.

# To all Club Members and R/C friends,

As you know Del Silva passed away in July and his wife Cheri ask if we would sell his R/C planes and equipment. Del was new to building and flying but did build four planes that are listed with pictures on the following page. His finishing touches are typically novice but all the planes have flown except the Bandito.

I will be taking all the items to our flying field on Saturday, Oct. 14th, the day of our Fun Fly. The items will be available to examine around 10:30 am and buying will begin at 11:00 am.
