# **MISTER MULLIGAN**



Here is another Gene Fuson creation, a great looking Mister Mulligan. It has a 52.5 inch wingspan. It has a Turnigy GK3-4240-530KV motor, a 13X8 prop, a 70 amp OPTO ESC with external 5 amp UBEC and is powered by a 4 cell Turnigy 14.8 volt 3300 mAH battery. Control is by a Spektrum AR 6200 receiver, 6 Hitec HS-81 servos and has working flaps.

Designed specifically for the Bendix Trophy race, it was one of the fastest planes flying in 1935.

# OCTOBER 12TH FUN FLY FIRST EVENT WILL START AT 11:00 AM BBQ AFTER THE Fun Fly

There will be three events.

**Event 1. 3 Minutes of Landings.** Take off and land and completely circle the pylon (360 deg) to complete the landing. Take off and repeat as many times as possible. Time starts when plane moves and stops in 180 seconds. Most landings wins.

**Event 2. Howard's Spot Landing.** Take off, do a loop, and land in the square on the field. Closest touch down to the square wins.

**Event 3. Precision Dead Stick.** Take off, climb to altitude, cut the power (turn off motor) and glide to and stop on target. Plane must glide for at least 30 seconds or be disqualified. Closest to the target wins.
