# LAST POLARIS XL KIT?



The above Polaris XL was built by your Editor, from a kit former member Jim Halbert had stashed away in his shop. The kit was produced by Model Aero that had several Depron sheet model designs which flew very well. Several of our Club members have had great fun flying the Polaris XL model. It seems that Model Aero may have gone out of business or at least has disappeared from the internet. So, if you have one, fly it carefully or if you want one you may be able to find someone on the internet that has a kit they will sell. Or maybe you could find someone that had made templates of the Polaris parts and make your own kit. It has been done successfully!

### THE PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Here's a short update on our missing Steel Carport Canopy. As all of you probably know, the shade Canopy at our field was blown away last month by an 85 MPH wind. It flew or sailed over 300 feet landing 100 feet off the south end of the runway. I'm sure it broke It was completely destroyed. some record. There was additional damage too. Our original wooden canopy and pilot stations took a hit also. AMA was contacted about the possibility of coverage by insurance but there was none. They suggested that our Club apply for grant money that was available under AMA's Club Disaster Relief Program. After a phone call, several pictures, a written explanation and help from a very courteous representative, we qualified and have received a check for \$500 towards any repairs we wish to do...... Good news! Thank you AMA.

At our next Club meeting we will discuss in more detail which direction we should take regarding the canopy. We'll plan a work day to repair our original wood shelter. Also we need to remove and dismantle the steel canopy from the property and take it to the local scrap yard.

Gary and Kathy Metzger were visiting Branson and were going to stop by the field but that particular day it was raining so those plans were washed out. We'll have to postpone seeing them until they visit again. Sorry we missed them. Jack McEvoy was going to come over too but that didn't work out either. Of course Jack can stop by any time to check out what's going on - you're always welcome.

Not a whole lot of flying this month. Janet and I were away for a couple of weeks and high heat and a little rain interrupted the flight plans of most of our fliers.

Homer Zobel has a new .91 War Bird he is building and it looks great. Don Johnson finished 2 amphibious planes that belonged to Jim Halbert. A Polaris XL (39" Wing) and an Aqua Cat which is slightly smaller than the Polaris. Last week after a bit of battery shifting and a little trim, they flew exceptional.

## THE EDITOR'S NOTE PAD

The Polaris XL shown on the front page has successfully had its' maiden flight and flew well after test pilot, John Woods, made a few adjustments. Also the Aqua Cat, shown with the Polaris XL on the next page are both amphibious so President John and your editor are planning on flying both off Table Rock Lake soon. It should be a lot of fun and hope to have some pictures for the next issue of The Windsock.

While at the lake, your Editor has a plan built CANADAIR CL 415 twin engine seaplane that has failed to get off the water after several tries. He plans to try to fly it

again. It was built in 2002. Since then the speed 400 brushed electric motors have been replaced



by brushless motors. Also it was converted to Spektrum and Li-Po batteries in 2012. This increased RPM almost 9% and decreased weight about 19% but no attempt fly it occurred after the conversion. Maybe getting rid of my boat had something to do with this. Hopefully these changes will result in successful flight.

# SAFETY FIRST
